

Magor & Undy Community Hub (MUCH)

Brief history of the site

The site was highlighted as a possible location for a community building way back in the 1980's and was designated as such.

The first build attempt was undertaken by a combined group involving villagers and the Community Council. This project was partly funded by a loan taken out by the Community Council but the plans were to build an amenity almost the size of a large leisure centre and it relied on a grant being obtained from the National Lottery. Unfortunately successive grant applications failed but some of the loan was used to construct the current car park and other works to get the project underway.

During this period it was also realised that the orchard that is included in the site was actually one of a few, if not the only, medieval orchards left in Wales.



Recent History

In 2016 a new local group of villagers got together to try to resurrect the project (The Three Fields Community Trust / MUCH group).

A survey was conducted to try to gauge what the villagers of Undy & Magor wanted to see available on the site and in a possible 'village hall', rather than a large centre.

From the survey, discussions took place to determine the requirements of a hall, to try to accommodate as many of the responses of the survey as possible.

Visits to village halls in the locality were undertaken to gain best practice on the running and the actual layouts.

During this initial phase it was also determined that community funding would become available as part of the Rockfield Farm housing development. This resulted in Monmouthshire County Council becoming directly involved in the project who are responsible for the build stage.

Once built, it is intended that the amenity will be handed over to the local villagers to manage.



What's happening now?

Monmouthshire County Council have engaged Pentan Architects of Cardiff, to prepare initial floor plans and sketches to be submitted for a pre-planning application to the Local Planning Authority. These have been designed in conjunction with the MUCH group, to fulfil the perceived needs of various village groups and the general population of the villages.


The current consultation sessions are therefore designed to raise awareness of the draft plan and to allow villagers to make suggestions, comments or even objections before the design is finalised.




A statement from Pentan, the Architects

What will be included Outside?

- •In the short term:
 - •We hope to provide outside seating areas where people can enjoy getting together in any of the very short periods of nice weather we get!
 - •We would also like to tidy the medieval orchard and possibly provide fixed BBQ's (Health & Safety permitting)
- •In the longer term (fund generation dependant):
 - •We would like to provide a path right around the perimeter of the site to provide a safe, traffic-free walking/jogging track.
- •Also, with the likely building of the proposed Walkway station, at the back of the site, there may be the opportunity to provide ticketing, information and other facilities to bring extra income into the community
